Facebook has admitted to scraping public photos and posts from Australian adult users to train its AI, without offering the opt-out option available in the European Union. This practice, which excludes minors but may still capture images of them through others' accounts, has raised privacy concerns. Labor and Greens senators have criticized Meta's data policies, urging stronger Australian privacy laws to align with European standards. The inquiry fuels debates over the balance between technological advancements and privacy rights, particularly in the context of AI training.

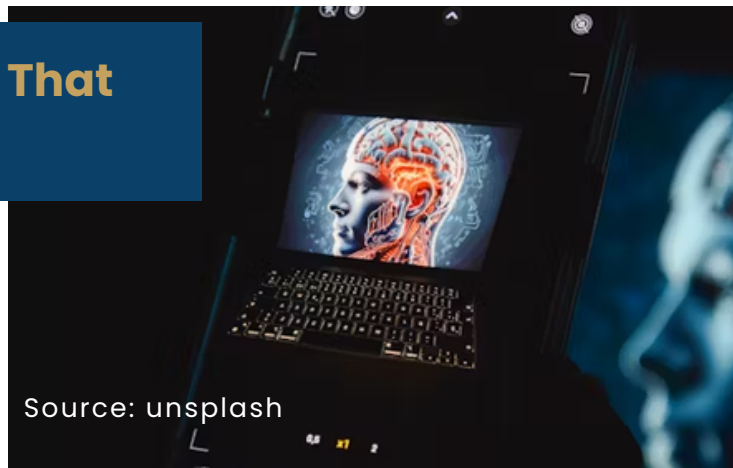

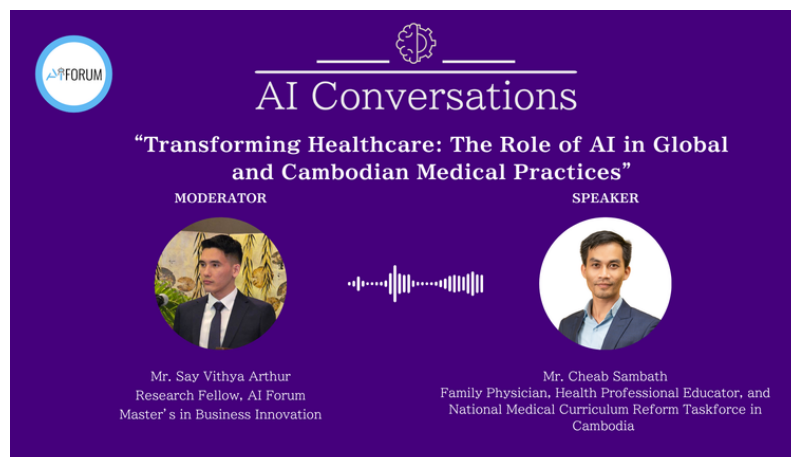

5. SolarWinds: IT professionals want stronger AI regulation

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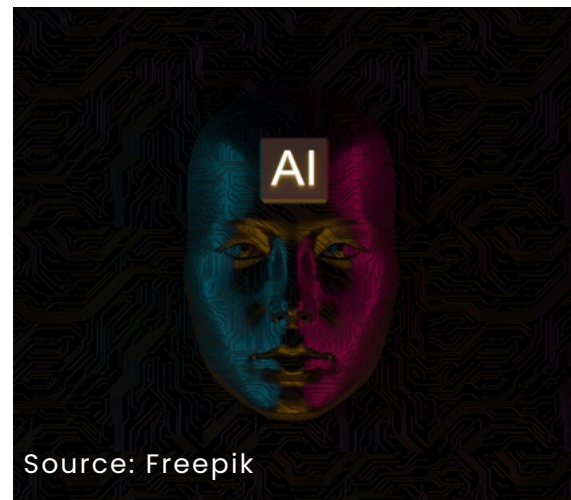
